LEVELS

USDF Introductory Level through Grand Prix, USDF and FEI Freestyle, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Qualifying classes.

Adult Amateur and JR/YR will be offered at Training through Fourth Level.

Q = Great American Insurance Group /USDF Qualifying Class.

A = Adult Amateur: USEF card must state Amateur or pay \$30 USEF Amateur fee.

J = Juniors and Young Riders: Must list birth date on entry. Parent/guardian must sign entry form.

O = Open: All riders who do not qualifications for Adult Amateur or Junior/Young Rider.

USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL: Riders are exempt from USEF/USDF rider/horse registration and membership fees unless they enter other classes, except for Opportunity Classes. All other UEF/USDF rules apply.

OPPORTUNITY & ACADEMY CLASSES: Riders are exempt from USEF/USDF rider/horse registration, membership fees and drug/meds fee unless they enter other non-opportunity classes, except for Introductory Level. All other USEF/USDF rules apply. Academy classes are open to horses used in a public lesson program only.

Quadrille and Pas De Deux Classes: Riders are exempt from USEF/USDF rider/horse registration and membership fees unless they enter other classes, except for Opportunity or Introductory Classes. All other USEF/USDF rules apply.

AWARDS

- Champion & Reserve Champion for each division
- Six ribbons in all classes.
- All ribbons & awards will be distributed by end of the day of the show.
- Any class with less than 10 AA/Jr./YR. riders will be combined with Open class.

STABLING

Limited permanent stalls with full wood doors will be available on the grounds. Preference will be given to those coming from out of state and then on a first come first serve basis. \$75.00 for one day, \$125.00 for 2 days. Initial bedding will be provided. Bag shavings will be available from the show office the day of your arrival or can be ordered in advance when submitting your entry. **No arrivals before 3 p.m. please the evening before the show is to begin.**

HELMET REQUIREMENT

Per DR120.5, effective 3/1/11, ANYONE mounted on a horse must wear protective headgear, except those riders age 18 and over while on horse that are competing *only* in FEI levels and tests at the Prix. St. Georges level and above.

DIRECTIONS

HEADING WESTBOUND ON IIE(495): West to exit 49N. Stay on the service road to first light. Make a right onto Pinelawn Road. Continue to Route 110 (Broad Hollow Road which becomes Walt Whitman Road but it is still Rte. 110) Make a right on Rte. 110. Continue to Route 25 (Jericho Tpke.). [There is a Friday's on corner of Rte. 110 and Rte. 25] Turn left on Rte. 25. Go ½ mile to West Hills Road. [There is a King Kullen/Rite Aid on that corner.] Make left on West Hills Road. Stanhope is less than ¼ mile on right.

FOR TRAILERS: Just after church is the service entrance. Turn right into service entrance and wait for parking attendant.

HEADING EASTBOUND ON IIE(495): East to exit 49N. Follow signs to Rte. 110 North. (Broad Hollow Road which becomes Walt Whitman Road but it is still Rte. 110), Continue to Route 25 (Jericho Tpke.). [There is a Friday's on corner of Rte. 110 and Rte. 25] Turn left on Rte. 25. Go ½ mile to West Hills Road. [There is a King Kullen/Rite Aid on that corner.] Make left on West Hills Road. Competition arena is: one 20 x 60 meter outdoor sand arena. Schooling on sand and grass and in the indoor arena. All lunging must be done in designated areas.

OTHER

The show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine any class without sufficient entries. **Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF rule book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.** Vet and Farrier will be on call the day of the show. Competitors wishing confirmation of entry should enclose a stamped, self-addressed postcard which will be mailed upon receipt of entries by the show secretary. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described vehicle's as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardians(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the

offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule are subject to penalty under Chapters 6 & 7, as well as issuance of a warning card.



USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. EC 7/21/08 Effective 12/1/08

Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule:

- 1) leadline;
- 2) exhibitions;
- 3) games and races;
- 4) classes for 4-H members;

- 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program);
- 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes;
- 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions;
- 8) Opportunity classes;
- 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation,;
- 10) USEA beginner novice division; and
- 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the USDF Directory or the USDF Web site at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDFr recognized competitions as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Membership (IM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their business membership.)

Horses competing at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed shows must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USDF recognized competition, and not able to present either a USDF membership or NM identification card or verification certificate, or a USDF LHR or USDF HID card or verification certificate to the competition secretary, must complete a USDF Affidavit form, and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Regional Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBC) at DSHB competitions, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, or FEI ParaEquestrian classes are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot and academy classes. For foreign-owned horses competing in a CDI, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport in lieu of a USDF HID or Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) number.

- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are Handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Dressage at Stanhope Stables

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$62), 5-years (\$250), or life (\$1,000). A Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for members under 21 (as of December 1 of the current membership year) for \$35. A PM allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals, and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Membership (IM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Member Organization (IMO). The membership year is December 1 through November 30. An IM allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed competitions, and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF Business Membership (\$175) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. Business Memberships satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: Effective 10/1/2007: For each USDF non-member owner/lessee and USDF nonmember rider there will be a USDF non-member fee of \$20 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF in addition to the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. For persons applying for the first time for a non-member number the \$5 affidavit fee is not required. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the non-member number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF non-member fee. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$20). Scores earned by a horse with an HID will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$65. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID. An HID does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with a LHR (\$85) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has a LHR it does not need an HID. A LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Non-Member (NM) identification number, Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date received by the competition secretary.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 33,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and

damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

2010 USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program

The USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program is designed to specifically recognize and encourage adult amateurs riding at Second Level.

Awards

1. USDF/Dover Saddlery Medal Recipient

The eligible rider with the highest score of 60 percent or better in the designated Second Level Test Three class or applicable test of choice USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal class at a participating competition will receive a handcrafted USDF/Dover Saddlery pewter medal and neck ribbon. Winners will receive a \$20 Dover Saddlery gift certificate for the first three USDF/Dover Saddlery Medals they win during the competition season.

2. USDF/Dover Saddlery National Merit Award

A USDF/Dover Saddlery National Merit Award will be awarded to riders winning three USDF/Dover Saddlery Medals in the same competition year.

3. Year-End Awards

The USDF/Dover Saddlery Medal National Champion and Reserve Champion are determined from the average of the top three winning ride scores during the competition year. The champion receives a \$1000 Dover Saddlery gift certificate and the reserve champion receives a \$500 Dover Saddlery gift certificate.

Rider Eligibility

To be eligible, a rider must meet the following criteria:

1. Rider must be a current USDF participating or group member at the time of the competition.
2. Rider must be an adult amateur in accordance with Article GR1306 of the USEF rules and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur as of the competition date.

2010 Great American Insurance Group/ USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), licensed by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a GMO is received by April 1 of the prior year.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying & Championships:

Rider:

- Must be a USDF Participating Member at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships. (Participating Members are USDF members who join USDF directly)
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Horse:

- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered (LTR) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Dressage at Stanhope Stables

- USDF horse registration and USEF horse/recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.
- A horse is not required to have registry papers.

Owner:

- Must be a USDF member (Participating or Business) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Minimum Qualifying Scores

One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Grand Prix, in three divisions: Open, Adult Amateur, and Junior/Young Rider. FEI Junior Rider and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only Open divisions. The minimum percentages are as follows:

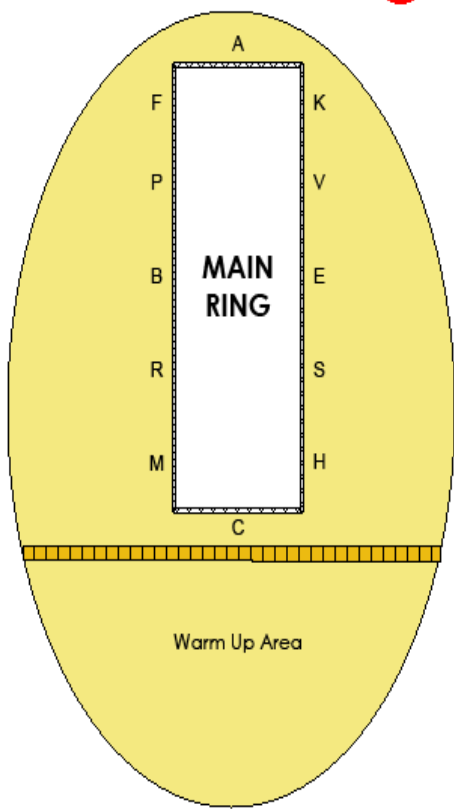

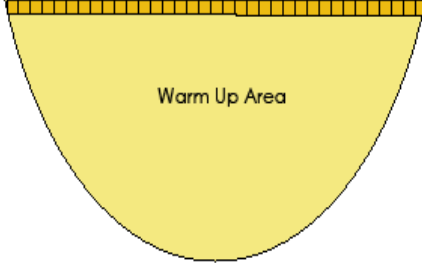

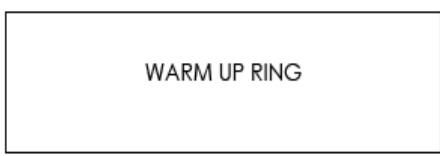
